Our Guest Speaker was Bill Kroth, he spoke about Franklinite and it's unique mineral properties and now it's location in Ogdensburg and Franklin in relation to other areas around the world. He also explained why Frankinite is the most logical choice to be proposed as the New Jersey state mineral.



Bill's program discussed the scientific reasoning on how the minerals settled in Sussex County from Ice Age to now and how the various occurrences happened to make those unique deposits. He further explained the reasoning why Zinc is vital to so many different aspects of life. From a mineral for human consumption to why

it is added to provide longer product life of that product.

Bill was gracious enough to make his presentation on both March 7th and an encore presentation on April 19th, due to a date change and lack of advertisement for the first presentation.

At both presentations, Bill discussed "The Decendent: A Pictorial History of the Sterling Mine" by Carissa Horuzy, an Ogdensburg native, who researched, collected and incorporated photos into a pictural book of those who had worked at Sterling Mine. The book is now available at Sterling Hill Mine and Museum.

BILL NAMING FRANKLINITE AS OFFICIAL STATE MINERAL PASSES ASSEMBLY

TRENTON, N.J. – New Jersey has an official state bird, two state foods, and even a microbe, but not an official mineral.

That is likely about to change. Since 2015, Sussex County legislators and school children have pushed to declare a state mineral. On Thursday, the Assembly passed a bill (S1727/A3393) that designates Franklinite the official mineral of the state of New Jersey.

"Franklinite is as unique to New Jersey as the Pine Barrens are, and was the driving force behind the state's thriving mining industry in the 19th and 20th centuries," Assemblyman Parker Space (R-Sussex), one of the bill's prime sponsors, said. "The discovery and mining of this rare ore built Franklin. Its importance can't be overstated."

In 1819, French geologist Pierre Berthier discovered Franklinite, a reddish-brown or black zinc ore found only in Franklin and Ogdensburg boroughs and named for Benjamin Franklin. More than 33 million tons of zinc were mined over 250 years, and used in products ranging from sunblock to car tires, to cosmetics and brass. More than 350 minerals were found in the areas two mines, 19 of them found nowhere else on Earth.

According to an oral history shared in the Daily Record back in 2015, driven by the demand for that rare ore, Franklin became a booming mining town for 60 years. However, after the ore was exhausted, the Franklin Mine eventually shut down in 1954, and Sterling Hill Mine in Ogdensburg in 1986.

The memory of this industry and the contributions it made not only to the region but the entire state are kept alive through the efforts of Franklin Mineral Museum, the Sterling Hill Mining Museum, and the Franklin-Ogdensburg Mineralogical Society.

"There are too many people to thank individually who helped get this bill to the Governor's desk. But I need to mention it was originally Jeff Osowski of the Sterling Hill Mining Museum that built the momentum for this years ago, Bill Truran who took a keen interest in organizing support when he became the Sussex County Historian in 2019, and the students in Franklin, Ogdensburg,

Hardyston and Sparta who kept writing letters to get this out of committee and onto the Assembly floor," Assemblyman Hal Wirths (R-Sussex), the Assembly bill's other sponsor, observed. "Parker and I are grateful for the community involvement from our local elected officials to our schools that has led to this recognition of the giant contributions little Sussex County has made to the state's history and economy."

Sen. Steven Oroho's bill passed in the Senate in October 2022. The bill now goes to the governor's desk for signing.



OGDENSBURG HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Ogdensburg Historical Society is a non-profit and non-partisan organization formed not only to ascertain and preserve the history of Ogdensburg, NJ, but also to foster the education and preservation of Ogdensburg history for its residents and visitors. The OHS obtained grant monies in 1988 and 1989 to refurbish the 1910 school addition/firehouse to be converted into the Old Schoolhouse/Firehouse Museum—the society's headquarters.

The museum's first floor lobby holds a display case (that was originally in the grade school) with minerals from the Ogdensburg Zinc Mine. The fire truck bays contain the Ogdensburg Fire Department's retired 1935 and 1959 American LaFrance Pumper trucks. In June of 2006, the bays were dedicated in the memory of William "Doly" Dolan and Joseph Fitzgibbons, Sr. These men were former students, OFD fire chiefs and OHS charter members and vice presidents—all within the walls of this building.

The second floor serves as a meeting hall for the society's meetings. It contains showcases which hold donated Ogdensburg memorabilia old Ogdensburg, school history and graduation pictures, a scale model of the mine's hoist, and Ogden family history documents. There are also old exhibits of Thomas A. Edison memorabilia to honor the ten years Edison spent mining iron ore at the old Edison Ore Milling Company on Sparta Mountain, as well as memorabilia showcasing our town and first responders and the VFW.

The OHS sponsors two annual dinners. In June, a catered picnic meeting is held at the Sterling Hill Mining Museum. In October, an Ethnic Dinner is held at the school where each family is asked to bring a covered dish that represents their ethnic background.
