

REGULAR MEETING  
MAY 10, 2010

The fifth regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg, Sussex County, New Jersey was held in the Council Chambers of the Borough Hall on May 10, 2010.

Mayor Sekelsky called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Upon roll call the following council members appeared and answered the call: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Notice requirements of the Open Public Meeting Act, NJSA 10:4-6 et. Seq. have been satisfied with a schedule of all meetings, together with the time, location and agenda of same being sent to the New Jersey Herald and New Jersey Sunday Herald and posted on the bulletin board on January 4, 2010.

Councilman Hann moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to approve the items on the Consent Agenda:

1. Approval of Minutes from March 6, 2010, Budget Workshop
2. Approval of Minutes from March 8, 2010, Regular Meeting
3. Approval of Minutes from March 22, 2010 Work Session

Yeas; Blahut(Abstain #3) ,Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood (Abstain #3)

Councilman Hann moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to open the Public Portion of the meeting. Yeas; Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Being that there was no public comment, Councilman Ingerto moved, Councilman Hann seconded motion to close the Public Portion of the meeting. Yeas; Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Mayor Sekelsky presented Pat Sabourin of the Ogdensburg First Aid Squad with their yearly proclamation.

Councilman Hann moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to adopt the following resolution as amended

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ogdensburg has adopted a Section 125 Plan allowing employees to waive health insurance and receive a payment; and

WHEREAS, the current payment is equal to 40% of the current base premium which the Borough is paying for employees benefits to be adjusted annually, and

WHEREAS per Governor Christie's reform plan there will be a reduction in the payment to employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg that the payment shall be reduced from 40% to 25% per Governor Christie's directive.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be effective as of June 1, 2010. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood. Copy attached as Schedule 1.

Councilman Hann moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to adopt the following resolution.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg to reappoint Blanche Stuckey as Land Use Board Secretary for one day a week with the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with one half hour for lunch at the rate of \$15. 00/per hr., plus a \$75.00 stipend for meetings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be effective retroactive as of May 3, 2010.

Councilman Ingerto moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to adopt the following resolution.

WHEREAS, R. Rothman, has paid for a lien against Block 24 Lot 2 for the years 2007, 2008, 2009, & part of 2010 in the amount of \$15,715.86 with interest and statutory fees of \$2,595.84, sale cost of \$42.00 and premium of \$4,600.00 totaling \$22,953.70.

WHEREAS the homeowner has paid the lien on said block and lot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg that the proper officials be authorized and hereby instructed to refund the amount of \$22,953.70 to R. Rothman.

Councilman Wood moved, Councilman Hann seconded motion to adopt the following resolution,

**WHEREAS**, the interest arbitration process was intended to fairly and adequately give all due consideration to the interest and welfare of the taxpaying public and support local government aims by arriving at award decisions that are equitable to all involved parties, including municipalities and Police and Fire Department personnel; and

**WHEREAS**, The New Jersey Employer-Employee Relations Act, adopted in 1968, was amended in 1977 to provide for interest arbitration as the statutorily imposed terminal step in the collective bargaining process for police and fire personnel as defined by the Act; and

**WHEREAS**, the Police and fire Interest Arbitration Reform Act (L.1995, c.425) was signed into law by Governor Christine Todd Whitman and became effective on January 10, 1996; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2005, the League of Municipalities' Arbitration Reform Committee suggested a number of Legislative reforms to the Interest Arbitration Reform Process among the changes propose by the Reform Committee were that: (1) the Arbitrator may not award salary increases in excess of the expenditure cap (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45 et seq.); (2) the Arbitrator's Award may provide for salary increases limited to the budget cap imposed by the State of New Jersey and/or any lawful adjustment adopted by the public employer; and (3) the Arbitrator's award may provide for salary increases limited to the percentage established by the State, or the lawful adjustment adopted by the public employer, as may be appropriate, on a department line basis; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2007, the Police and Fire Interest Arbitration statute was amended to add a new ninth factor of the 4% Tax Levy Cap which resulted in 4 of the 9 statutory factors in Interest Arbitration addresses the employer's fiscal situation; and

**WHEREAS**, municipalities are bound by strict fiscal controls embodied in the expenditure limit and tax levy caps and it is the norm rather than the exception for state approved arbitrators to award raises for police salaries at rates that exceed the annual caps; and

**WHEREAS**, binding arbitration awards in excess of the caps forces municipalities to cut other critically needed municipal services in order to fund salary increases, compounded by pension, to police and fire personnel, and cost for police and fire services continue to spiral at an unacceptable rate; and

**WHEREAS**, the State approved interest binding arbitration process is inconsistent with the State cap laws and is unfair to municipalities attempting to control property taxes through fiscal responsibility; and

**WHEREAS**, interest arbitration should be reformed to provide that the cost of living and the employer's ability to pay should be given greater weight, and the total costs of the arbitrator's award, including steps and cost of living (COLA) increases, should not exceed the cost of living; and

**WHEREAS**, arbitrators should be required to evaluate and analyze the total cost of the salaries and benefits, including step increases, and must provide a detailed line item analysis and explanation of the costs in the award; and

**WHEREAS**, arbitrators must also evaluate and analyze the overall compensation received by the bargaining unit, including vacations, longevity, holidays, excused leave, medical and pension benefits; and

**WHEREAS**, arbitrators should be required to live in New Jersey, and the process of selecting the arbitrators and the length of time the Arbitration process takes need to be reviewed.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Ogdensburg, Sussex County and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The governing body hereby urges the New Jersey State Legislature to pass legislation containing substantial reforms to the binding arbitration process.
2. That certified copies of this resolution be transmitted to Governor Chris Christie, President of the Senate, Stephen M. Sweeney, Speaker of the Assembly, Shelia Y. Oliver, Senator, Steven Oroho, Assemblyman Gary Chiusano, Assemblywoman Alison Littell McHose, the New Jersey League of Municipalities and all Sussex County municipalities.

Councilman Ciasullo moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to open the public hearing on an ordinance entitled **AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER III, SECTION 12 OF HE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF OGDENSBURG ENTITLED LICENSING AND REGULATING JUNKYARD**

**KEEPERS AND DEALERS.** Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

There being no comment from the public, Councilman Ciasullo moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to close the public hearing. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Councilman Ciasullo moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to adopt said ordinance. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood. Copy attached as Schedule 8.

Councilman Wolstenholme moved, Councilman Hann seconded motion to open the public hearing on an ordinance entitled **AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OGDENSBURG TO REFLECT AN INCREASE OF MINIMUM HEIGHT FROM 30 TO 35 FEET.** Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

There being no comment from the public, Councilman Wolstenholme moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to close the public hearing. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Councilman Wolstenholme moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to adopt said ordinance. Yeas; Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood. Copy attached as Schedule 9

Councilman Ciasullo moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to introduce an ordinance entitled **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER III, POLICE REGULATIONS, SECTION 3-6, REGULATIONS FOR MEMORIAL PARK AND HEATERS POND OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF OGDENSBURG** on first reading. Public hearing is scheduled for June 14, 2010.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg, County of Sussex and State of New Jersey that Chapter III of the General Ordinances shall be amended as follows:

**SECTION 1.**

A new Section 3-6.1(i) shall be added and read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of 17 years of age to be upon the beaches and lands adjoining Heaters Pond between dusk and dawn from Sunday through Saturday year round. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a minor accompanied by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care or custody of minor, or where the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care or custody of minor.

**SECTION 2.**

A new Section 3-6.5(20) shall be added and read as follows:

Smoking shall be prohibited at all times within Memorial Park and Heaters Pond.

**SECTION 3. Severability.**

If any provision of this ordinance or the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 4. Repealer.**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed in their entirety.

**SECTION 5. Effective Date.**

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and publication according to law.

**NEW BUSINESS**

Mayor Sekelsky spoke about the RCA's and discussed an applicant who needs help but because of her situation when she applied to the state she didn't qualify. The amount owed on the house is more than the house is worth. Councilman Wood feels it is very risky, and would rather go to other residents on the list first then revisit this applicant again. After a brief discussion, Councilman Hann moved, Councilman Wood seconded motion to accept application for resident at present time. Yeas: None. Nays: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Carlos Travaras has made a formal request for an outside festival with barbeque and drinking. Councilman Wood's concern is if there is enough parking. Councilman Blahut asked what time of day would the festival be. Mr. Travaras stated 12 noon to 7pm. Having a police officer was discussed. Mr. Travaras is willing to pay for a police officer if necessary. Councilman Ingerto discussed a driveway repair estimate that was handed in by a homeowner for damages done. Councilman Ingerto feels the Department of Public Works can do the repair. Councilman Ingerto stated the damage is in the right of way and is looking to council for advice. Councilman Ciasullo stated if it's on town property the town should fix it. Survey will be looked at and decision will be made. Councilman Ingerto also spoke about getting a new air conditioner for the council room. Councilman Ingerto spoke about Memorial Day services and the letter from Chief Lott who asked for permission to clean up the memorial at the pond. Permission was granted.

Mayor Sekelsky spoke about street lighting for a new development and will call the Engineer to ask about energy saving lighting and pricing. Will also ask about zoning. Councilman Ciasullo spoke about the inspection on the Dam for approval. Councilman Ciasullo also spoke about having the Tax Assessor review the Sterling Hill Mine to see if they are assessed properly. There is activity of non mining going on at the property. All property may not be subject to tax exemption.

Mayor Sekelsky went over the proposal for copiers for the office. After a brief discussion, Councilman Wood moved, Councilman Hann seconded motion for approval of two new copiers. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

Councilman Ingerto asked about shared service with the School.

Mayor Sekelsky spoke about water by the dam and stated there is a puddle of water by the outside of the Dam that should not be there. Councilman Ciasullo said he will check it out. Mayor Sekelsky also spoke about having a cell tower and mentioned a company had inquired previously but nothing came of it as yet. Attorney spoke about having a cell tower in town and the benefits. The Mayor also asked about a public works certificate

from a vendor who may be doing work for the Borough. Councilman Ciasullo spoke about repairing the dam and that the project that cannot be broken up. Needs to be under threshold and will have to re spec out the job and get three new estimates. Councilman Ciasullo will speak to Ken Smith about having the Department of Public Works do work by the Dam.

Councilman Wolstenholme gave an update on paving Edison Rd. and working with Sparta to finish. Councilman Wolstenholme stated Sparta is ready to help work on the road. Councilman Wolstenholme discussed the permit that came in to the lower lake and proposal for inspection of dam. The water department is ready to proceed with new meters for installation. They could install eight meters a day. Councilman Wolstenholme informed Mayor and Council the county will give us six links of pipe 48 feet long. Hoping to get 60 feet which is better. Discussed a proposal to put in two flared ends at \$9,629.00 from Oldcastle Precast.

At 9:15 pm, Councilman Wood moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to go into Executive Session to discuss contractual issues. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Hann, Ingerto, Wolstenholme, Wood.

After returning from Executive Session at 9:50 pm, Mayor and Council continued with the regular meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

Councilman Wood discussed the personnel manual and sick amount payout amendments. Wants to cap payout at \$15,000 and payout as either a lump sum or \$500 per month. Councilman Wood moved, Councilman Ingerto seconded motion to amend Sick Leave section of the Employee manual. Yeas: Blahut, Ciasullo, Ingerto, Wood. Nays: Wolstenholme. Budget to be amended to reflect the economic state of the Borough. Councilman Wood informed Mayor and Council that the FOP grievance has been resolved. Discussion also took place on Ms. Piea’s proposal to pay back fees. Councilman Ciasullo mentioned that there was nothing from the state regarding transitional aid. Deadline is May 23<sup>rd</sup> but apparently there is still no application available. If the Borough decides to apply, the CFO will explain what has to be done. Councilman Ciasullo also mentioned that the first set of water shut off letters went out. The water department monthly report has been amended and is easier to read. Regarding the permit for the Saw Mill Brook pictures of the flood and what was affected need to be provided to the state. Councilman Ingerto discussed purchasing flags through the VFW for the Municipal Building and the School. He also spoke to Hartman Roofing regarding the roof repair for the Historical Building and stated that they couldn’t do it for the price the Borough wanted.
