#### REGULAR MEETING

#### **FEBRUARY 10, 2014**

The second regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg, Sussex County, New Jersey was held in the Council Chambers of the Borough Hall on February 10, 2014. Mayor Ciasullo called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Upon roll call, the following Council members appeared and answered the call: Amodeo, Astor, Hutnick, McGuire, Opilla, Rizzo. Also in attendance was Borough Attorney, Michael Garofalo.

Notice requirements of the Open Public Meeting Act NJSA 10:4-6 et. Seq. have been satisfied with a schedule of all meetings, together with the time, location and agenda of same being sent to the NEW JERSEY HERALD and NEW JERSEY SUNDAY HERALD and posted on the bulletin board on January 2, 2014.

Councilman McGuire moved, Councilman Opilla seconded motion to approve all items on the consent agenda.

WHEREAS, the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority (hereinafter "SCMUA") has passed a resolution agreeing to shared services of their Certified Recycling Professional (CRP) with the Borough of Ogdensburg by providing the services of a CRP for submission of the Borough of Ogdensburg's 2013 Recycling Tonnage Report to the Department of Environmental Protection; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A 40A:65-1 et. Seq.) (hereinafter, "the Act") provides that local units of government may enter into a contract to provide or receive any service that either local unit participating in the Agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction, including services incidental to the primary purposes of any of the participating units (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-4); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ogdensburg will prepare the 2013 Recycling Tonnage Report; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ogdensburg has requested the services of the SCMUA in the form of the District Recycling Coordinator as a Certified Recycling Professional to certify and submit the required 2013 Borough of Ogdensburg Recycling Tonnage Report to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection by April 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the SCMUA has the qualified staff to certify the Recycling Tonnage Report prepared by the Borough of Ogdensburg and electronically submit it to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection on behalf of the Borough of Ogdensburg under the terms and conditions set forth in the Shared Services Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and Council are hereby authorized and directed to execute a Shared Services Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto, with SCMUA for the provision of Certified Recycling Professional Services to certify and submit the Borough of Ogdensburg's 2013 Recycling Tonnage Report to NJDEP.
- 2. All SCMUA Staff and Professionals are authorized to take any and all necessary actions to see to the implementation of this Resolution
- 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Councilman Opilla moved, Councilman McGuire seconded motion to open the public session of the meeting. Yeas: Amodeo, Astor, Hutnick, McGuire, Opilla, Rizzo.

Michael Blahut, 86 Kennedy Avenue asked if anyone had any questions regarding the 5K Run to be held on June 21, 2014. Mr. Blahut also asked if the Borough had a new Chief of Police. Mayor informed Mr. Blahut that Sgt. Gordon is presently running the police department. Mr. Blahut asked if there is any news on the gas line. Mayor Ciasullo informed him that they did surveys with two developments and received good feed back and there is good potential to start doing surveys in other areas.

George Morville, Risk Management Insurance Agent spoke about the underground storage tanks and insurance coverage for the tanks. Because Zurick who has been covering the Borough tanks are no longer covering underground storage tanks the Borough will be switching to Statewide Insurance. The insurance company is requesting the tanks to be pressure tested. The cost would be \$375.00 per tank. Mr. Morville said he could set up the testing for this week. Mayor Ciasullo discussed water billing issues and said they need to make a decision on what to do with the incorrect billings. It was stated that the problems need to be identified and straightened out. After a brief discussion Council had no questions and agreed to move forward with the process of straightening out the billing. Helen Bolton, 11 Beardslee Hill Drive asked if the town was going to go back on previous billings for incorrect charges and the Mayor informed her that the town was not going back on any billings.

There being no further business from the public, Councilman Opilla moved, Councilman Hutnick seconded motion to close the public session of the meeting. Yeas: Amodeo, Astor, Hutnick, McGuire, Opilla, Rizzo.

Councilman McGuire moved Councilman Hutnick seconded motion to approve ATS Environmental to do pressure testing on the underground storage tanks for the Borough at a price of \$375.00 per tank for insurance coverage. Yeas: Amodeo, Astor, Hutnick, McGuire, Opilla, Rizzo.

Councilman Opilla moved, Councilman McGuire seconded motion to do a resolution for the Ogdensburg Water Department to correct records moving forward with the billings based on accurate and inaccurate readings and not to provide any retroactive billings to residents as long as they have covered the minimum quarterly payment on past billings. Yeas: Amodeo, Astor, Hutnick, McGuire, Opilla, Rizzo.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Councilman Astor spoke about the hours for the Recycling Center. The Recycling Center will be opened from early Saturday mornings until the containers are full. When the dumpsters are full, the center will be closed. The Borough is in the process of getting larger containers for the recycling center. The matter of reaching the DPW Supervisor on his cell phone was discussed. Council feels his phone should always be manned. Councilman McGuire is working on getting a better camera system for the recycling center and has received two quotes so far. One is for a high tech camera which can monitor from anywhere; the cost is \$4,500 to \$5,000. The cost for an analog type camera is \$2,300, which doesn't have the same range capacity. Councilman McGuire has calls out to two other companies.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

Councilman Amodeo informed Mayor and Council that the quote from Aquatic Analysts, Inc. for the treatment of Heaters Pond has come in and their prices are the same as last year. Council will decide how many times they need to treat the pond. Councilman Amodeo also mentioned that the permit for the geese depredation will need to be filled out also. Councilman Amodeo asked Council to start thinking about a camera/monitor for inside the Police Department. Councilman McGuire spoke about the Dr. Pepper/Snapple Park Bin Grant for recyclables. The

Part of the grant would require the Borough to submit a report at six months and one year intervals on how much recycling is collected. The Borough will be applying for the grant. Councilman McGuire also mentioned that the contract for fireworks for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was sent in and we now have to send in a deposit for \$7,500. Mayor Ciasullo spoke about a letter the Borough has received from the NJ Land Trust regarding a couple of pieces of property they would be interested in. Private residents were also contacted by the Land Trust. Mayor Ciasullo called to ask some questions and will look into it further. It was said that once land is sold to the Land Trust it is out of the Borough's hand and the Borough can never get it back. Councilman Astor mentioned that a delivery of salt should be coming in the next two weeks but because the Department of Public Works is so low on salt they will not be salting the roads as often. Also mentioned was one of the trucks is being worked on and the garage door, which got damaged is also being fixed.

Carlos Travaras, owner of Atlantic Manor came before Council to ask for documentation showing the payments he has made towards his taxes. He is refinancing and the bank would like to see proof of payments. The Borough attorney said he would draw up a contract for Mr. Travaras to sign off on and give to his bank.

Councilwoman Rizzo moved, Councilman Hutnick seconded motion to adopt the following resolution.

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975, permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ogdensburg, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, as follows:
