OLD BUSINESS

Heaters Pond Dam – Councilman Opilla reported there were some delays in March due to the weather but they did get back on track. The anticipation that the pond will be filled in time for the upcoming season for swimming. Right now it looks like the schedule is that they are doing repair to the concrete to the old dam there was some chipping on the back end, the stop logs and aluminum framing have been installed and replaced. The guide rail should be completed in May. We should be on track to have the pond filled back up in the beginning of June. Borough Hall has received several calls regarding the fish in the pond. Councilman Gunderman has made a few calls, we do have some things in the works we are trying to figure out the timing, and we will be replenishing the fish on the pond as part of the project. That should be done in June as well.

Councilman Astor commented awhile back he had mentioned the school was going to have the third grade go to Heaters Pond, with the Water Shed Ambassador. Councilman Astor asked if the port a john's would be there by that time which is May 31st. They are going to plant 50 trees and shrubs. Councilman Astor commented he will reach out to Chris regarding getting dirt and mulch because there are a lot of rocks up there. Councilman Astor asked the Chief of Police last year the second graders walked up to Heather Pond and was escorted by the Police and requested an escort for this year. Chief Gordon commented to send him an email with the date and time.

Repair of Loop – Councilman Opilla reported we are getting a revised quote.

JCP & L – Councilman Opilla reported there was a meeting with Mayor Slater, Councilman Hutnick and Jackie Espinoza, JCP&L.

Councilman Hutnick reported we had discussed the LED lights. In some areas they are doing well but in some areas they are driving the residents crazy. They are also causing a problem with the Mine Telescope. Ms. Espinoza is looking into seeing if there is some kind of shield to cover the back of the lights by the homes and we will schedule a meeting with the Mine to talk with them. Councilman Hutnick also explained where additional lights are going to be installed.

Elizabethtown Gas – Councilman Opilla commented there have been some gas trucks in some of the neighborhood they are doing some surveys. The plan is to keep moving forward with a June or July time frame when they might start some of the work.

Well Update – Councilman Nardini reported we did order a part for the one well. Rob Lawler was present and explained the part didn't get come in yet. Once we get the part we will have both wells up and running.

Health Insurance – Councilman Opilla reported we received the renewal from our current provider in the Council packets is a rate sheet and break down of some of the comparisons of cost and explained. Councilman Opilla commented the Oxford rate overall for 2018 is a little over ten thousand dollars and to switch over to NJ State Plan is \$10,500. The cost isn't too great to make that switch, this is something discussed in the past and it is probably worthwhile to pursue this. From what we understand as a timing prospective is we probably have to renew the Oxford contract as it is today for the June 1st time frame so there is no lapse in coverage because for the State Plan to switch over it is about 75 to 90 days from the time we accept the resolution here at a Council meeting and all the paper work goes to the State.

Councilman Opilla commented what he is looking for tonight is to get an agreement with everyone that we want to pursue this. Obviously we have to address this with the FOP as well to get there approval.

Councilman Astor asked if the broker could come out and give us different options. Councilman Opilla explained we did this already and explained. Councilman Astor asked if the broker could come so we can ask questions. Councilman Opilla commented we can do that and we would like to do that with the FOP.

Mr. Briigliodoro commented you are looking at the Omnia Plan; Councilman Astor is looking to have the broker come here. If you rest of the Council feels that way we can set up a meeting with the broker and have him address the Council.

Councilman Nasisi commented he looked into this last year and this is pretty good, it's a tight number, a little overage and comparable.

Councilman Opilla commented we will schedule to have the broker come to the meeting May 29.

Code Book Codification – Councilman Opilla commented everything has been sent to the company; we are just waiting for them.

Guard Shack – Councilman Opilla asked Councilman Nardini if they were up there this past weekend. Councilman Nardini commented we were up there quite a few hours. Councilman Nardini explained what was done. It is a lot of work and heavy lifting.

Water Personnel – Councilman Nardini commented he need to confirm something with the Clerk and he will have the job description finalized.

Garbage Contract – Councilman Astor reported he believes we are moving forward with the transfer he read the email from Mr. Briigliodoro. Mr. Briigliodoro commented we have to make sure the insurance in effect protects the Borough.

Councilman Astor commented Goble our current company is looking to transfer the services to Blue Diamond. Blue Diamond is willing to take it over and also willing to provide an extra recycling day.

Bob Dorbor, Blue Diamond representative was present. Mr. Dorbor commented we will pick up the recycling bi-weekly so you will get 26 pickups a year it is every other week. Mr. Dorbor commented we are familiar with Ogdensburg and explained.

Tom Scerbo from Globe was present and explained what we are hoping to happen with the increase with recycling pick is that it will reduce the traffic at the recycling center because people will not be throwing it away so with the frequency improvement we should see a reduction down there. It will be a substantial benefit with no cost to the town.

Mr. Dorbor commented the recycling day would be on a Thursday. Trash will be on Wednesday from what he understands and explained.

Councilman Hutnick asked about bulk pickup. Mr. Dorbor commented the contract is going to stay the same we are just adding to the recycling

NEW BUSINESS

Street sweeping/Leaf pick up – Councilman Opilla reported we had a comment from someone in town the street sweepers came and people still had leaf and brush on the curb so they went around the leaf and brush leaving stone in the streets.

Councilman Astor explained we have to go with Sparta's schedule for the street sweeping and we borrow the truck from Lafayette for leaf and brush. Councilman Astor commented because of the tough winter and extra grid on the street the street sweeping cost an extra thousand dollars because they had to go back several times.

Town Wide Garage Sale – Councilman Opilla commented this has been discussed in the past. One resident wanted us to look into doing this, in the past we shied away from the town coordinate this.

Nancy Horuzy, 1 Ridge Ct. Ogdensburg commented she thinks it is a good idea.

Janine Tatka commented her mother in law ran the town wide garage sale in Franklin and explained what they did.

Councilman Nasisi commented these ladies have a great idea and maybe the Council should probably over see some of the things that will be going on.

There was a discussion on the town wide garage sale and maps for locations around town of residents participating in the sale.

Brenda Odell, commented friends of Heaters Pond would like to participate and would be willing to oversee it to get it running.

Councilman Astor commented we can support it with someone else running it.

Chief Gordon commented the only thing he sees a problem with is for example Passaic Ave. there is no parking; maybe for one day do a resolution to suspend parking rules on streets that have no parking.

Special Olympics Torch Run – Officer Lame commented every year we have a car wash at the fire house for the Special Olympics Torch Run, it is on the 26th. This year they asked Officer Lame to run the leg of the run and they asked him to run the torch at the opening ceremonies. We welcome everyone to come help out the day of the car wash. There is no cost just a donation. Volunteers are needed. The torch run is June 8th they will run it through here and then Officer Lame and Chief Gordon are going to go down to the opening ceremonies and that is when he will run the first leg into the ceremonies.

Sterling Hill Mine Train Overpass – Councilman Hutnick commented a few years ago we gave the Mine permission to paint the abandoned overpass. The mine is requesting to put up some sort of sign or banner. We reached out to George Morville he is ok with it as long as they provide a certificate of insurance.

Councilman Nasisi questioned if the Mine should check with Land Use since there are rules with banners. There was a discussion on a banner and checking with the ordinance, size, and placement of it.

Request for Easement – Councilman Opilla commented we have a resident in town on Cork Hill Road that is maintaining a piece of property that is adjacent to theirs that is actually Borough Property. They want to know if they can have an easement done or possibly purchase a small portion of the property they use.

Mr. Briigliodoro commented his understanding is there are some improvements that are now on the property which is Borough property. If that is the case we could grant them an easement but you want to make sure if you are going to grant an easement whether or not you want it to go on forever or do you want it for a certain period of time. You want to make sure it doesn't interfere with the Borough's ability to do anything with that in the future, there are different considerations. They really need to get a metes and bounds description of the exact area. There are different factors that would come into play. The next step would be to have the property owner's engineer provide a metes and bounds description.

Robert Szanyi, 75 Cork hill Road, was present for the discussion. Mr. Szanyi described the area and what he would like to do.

There was a discussion on an easement, purchase the property, Mr. Szanyi has been maintaining the property, an easement would be on the proposed road, an easement vs. purchasing the small section of the property, going before the Land Use Board and if it was legal to sell a portion of the a property requested.

Mr. Briigliodoro commented this needs to start with the property owner getting the metes and bounds for the property, then a title search/report to confirm ownership any liens or judgments or anything to make sure it is the Borough's property and we have the title to it and getting an appraisal on the property.

It is up to the property owner to obtain the documentation needed and to start with getting the metes and bounds, maybe to before the Land Use Board and speak to the Borough Engineer.

Councilman Nasisi suggested Mr. Szanyi speak to the Land Use Secretary and arrange to come to the next Land Use Meeting on May 22. Councilman Nasisi explained the Land Use Board would know if there are any DEP regulation now on the property because of this being considered swamp land, restrictions regarding bog turtles etc.

Memorial Day Parade – Councilman Opilla reminded everyone of the upcoming Memorial Day Parade.

Banners – Councilman Astor commented we have been talking about banners throughout town for many years. Chris found some banners and if we order them for Memorial Day we had to order them already. We spoke to the Mayor and to Rob and we all agree that Chris should order the banners. Therefore, we went ahead and ordered them and hopefully will have them here and up for Memorial Day. If we like them we can get seasonal banners.

Hot Water Heater and Roof Borough Hall – Councilman Nasisi commented he doesn't have any information on the roof yet. Councilman Nasisi explained he brought a plumber in to look at the hot water heater which isn't working. Councilman Nasisi commented he is working on getting quotes on that and explained repairs for the water heater and boiler for the Historical Society.

Teen Canteen – Councilman Gunderman commented on April 27 the Municipal Alliance Committee/Teen Canteen hosted a movie night at Sparta Movie Theater. We saw the Avengers; it was a great movie even for adults. We had 11 sign up and next year we hope to plan it earlier to have more kids sign up. They are also planning an end of year barbeque in June.

Vicky Schroder, Center Street, commented she figured she would put red, white and blue flowers so it would go for Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day. Then in September if everyone is ok she will put in mums. The only thing she would need from the town is water, she doesn't want to lug all that water uptown every week if it isn't raining can someone from the water department or someone go through and water them.

Councilman Hutnick explained he spoke to the Mayor and Ms. Schroder will identify what material she needs and then DPW can purchase them and pick it up.

PUBLIC SESSION

Councilman Hutnick moved, Councilman Gunderman seconded motion to open the public session of the meeting. All were in favor.

Taylor Odell, 17 Wilson, Ogdensburg stood up to speak. Mrs. Odell her mother spoke on behalf of Taylor commented Taylor wanted you to know she applied for a lifeguard position.

Councilman Opilla commented we are taking application now.

Councilman Nasisi commented thank you for your interest.

Sandy McCurtis, 16 Bettino Drive, commented in the past her daughter has done the Ms. Ogdensburg pageant, this year we would like to hold the pageant at Heater's Pond and we would need consent. We are looking at June 24th, which is a Sunday we do not have a rain date yet. Mrs. McCurtis is the being the spokes person for her daughter; who has all the information. There was a discussion on the use of Heaters Pond and judges would be out of town. An application for use of the pond would need to be completed.

Patrick Kalafut, 14 Avenue B. asked if there was a due date for the pond before they start getting fined or anything.

Councilman Nasisi commented days were lost because of the weather.

Brenda Odell, 17 Wilson, Ogdensburg, commented she had submitted an idea to Councilman Opilla by email and wanted to know where we were with the idea.

Councilman Opilla commented Ms. Odell had approached me about the Council giving her permission to do some flower beds up at Heaters Pond. We will not be spending any money, Ms. Odell is doing this by herself cost material etc. She is just looking for the Council's blessing. The question is where do you plan on planting. Are you using existing planters?

Ms. Odell commented she was going to build new ones, along the bottom of the base of the monument I believe it is 56 foot long I figured maybe two feet out with railroad ties or whatever wood we can donate to us. And then flower boxes 3 by 3 around the four trees that are at the top.

Frank Sanfilippo, Arch Street, commented on the banners across the Mine; make sure it is something nice. Mr. Sanfilippo commented back on December 6, there was court order to remove some stuff from his son's house. On December 6, Bettino Drive was shut down because there were 25 to 30 vehicles on that road from Stillwater Fire Department that wanted to come into his son's house and dismantle it. This could have been a very bad situation. The Sheriff's Department asked them to get off the property and away from our cars. They closed the street and wouldn't let cars up the street. He understands the Stillwater Fire Department is coming into

town for a fire parade; he understands they are doing cooking and the person who called all those people is very involved in the fire department and dispatched his boys to go to Bettino Drive.

Councilman Gunderman questioned why was the Stillwater Fire Department in Ogdensburg.

Mr. Sanfilippo commented the person suing the town and sheriff's department is involved with the Stillwater Fire Department.

Mrs. Sanfilippo commented she felt threatened; they wouldn't let her up the street in order to get to her son's house.

Mrs. Sanfilippo explained we just want you to be aware that this happened and Stillwater is coming here.

There being no further business from the public, Councilman Nardini moved, Councilman Gunderman seconded motion to close the public session of the meeting. All were in favor.
