Mayor Hutnick called the meeting to order at 7:00PM.

Mayor Hutnick commented everyone has heard all three candidates, thought things over and asked for a motion to select a candidate.

Councilman Nardini commented he would like to thank all the candidates; we really do appreciate everyone showing an interest, we are all up here ourselves because we are concerned about the tax dollars we spend how to do it responsibly.

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REINTRODUCTION TO ORDINANCE 10-2019

Councilman Nardini made a motion to reintroduce Ordinance 10-2019 entitled “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 6, “PARKS AND RECREATIONAL AREAS,” SECTION 6-1.2 (C) “REGULATIONS OF SWIMMING AREAS” OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF OGDENSBURG.” (Note: This ordinance was table at the May 13, 2019 and May 28, 2019 meetings)

Public hearing will be held June 24, 2019.

Councilwoman Slater commented this is for the dog’s right; I agree with it you will need to take the sign down that is up there then when you first pull in it says no dogs.

Seconded by Councilman Opilla.

Mr. McBriar commented so you guys are aware there were some minor changes that have been discussed throughout the last several meetings; the general rule is that no pets or animals are allowed but that general probation is qualified in two circumstances one is if the individual is in need of a pet or animal and if the pet or animal is trained or assist in disability and the other is as otherwise provided within that paragraph. There was some discussion to permit dogs within the Heaters Pond swimming and beach area during none activity hours so in that limited circumstances it is complicated within the permission of the Borough. This has been modified to allow that limited use for dogs during none activity hours. Again, that is when the beach is closed outside of twelve noon to six PM area and they are also not permitted during swim team practice occurs which maybe outside of that normal hour of operation or during swim team meets.

Mayor Hutnick commented we have been over this a few times and asked Councilwoman O’Dell if she would like to add anything. Councilwoman O’Dell said no.

RESOLUTION 56-2019

Councilman Opilla made a motion to adopt resolution of the Borough of Ogdensburg approving bid specifications for solid waste and recyclable material collection services and authorizing the Borough Clerk to advertise and receive bids for same.

Mayor Hutnick explained the resolution.

Seconded by Councilwoman Slater.

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Mr. McBriar commented the bid specs are governed by statute there are model bid specifications for solid waste and recyclable materials. Mr. McBriar commented he did look at what the Borough bid three years ago; to synopsis into the main points garbage will be collected once per week as it states currently. Bulky items once a month and recycling will be clarified. It was his understanding that recycling is being collected bi weekly not just twice a month but every other week. As you know the way the calendar falls generally the longer months it would be more than twice a month. With the bid specs and again he will address the verbiage, the current contract ends the end of August; there is an advertizing period that we have to satisfy so by approving this resolution tonight you are authorizing Robin and I to submit to the papers a notice to bidders as well as to finalize the bid specification package. It also includes Municipal sources that are identified in the last bid specs namely the Municipal Building, DPW, First Aid, Fire Department and the Elementary School. We are currently working on updating the municipal data sheet so that the current line items are included as well as last year's tonnage reports so that respective bidders will have a general idea of what the need is. If there are any questions let him know otherwise Robin and I will finalize that and advertize it.

There was a discussion on the solid waste pick up and bids; at this point Blue Diamond is not interested in extending their current contract and the possibility of a shared service with a neighboring town.

Freeholder Ms. Dawn Fantasia was present, Franklin has a long history with Blue Diamond that Robin is aware off, we [Franklin] explored options of going back to a town based [garbage pickup] and it is not cost effective. In other towns we spoke too did not have the capacity that maybe did their own to handle Franklin. It is worth asking.

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OLD BUSINESS

Borough Hall Roof– Councilman Nasisi commented paper work is going back and worth for the Borough Hall roof. Councilman Nasisi commented we have also been out at the pump house.

Steam Boiler for Historical Building – Councilman Nasisi commented no news on the boiler.

Block 30 Lot11.05 Wausau Street Septic Repair – Councilman Nasisi commented we opened everything up and permits are in receipt and explained. The Health Department wanted to make sure that all of the homes that were on that [community septic system] had their own septic. Thanks to the records and Robin helped out a lot, to identify all had a septic system and they all do so he was given the thumbs up by the County. We should have this wrapped up by the end of next week. Councilman Nasisi explained the work being done and material.

Crosswalk – Mayor Hutnick commented he has no update on the crosswalk.

Ogdensburg Day Update– Mayor Hutnick asked Mrs. Schroder to explain.

Vicky Schroder, Center Street in charge of Ogdensburg Day commented no real updates and questioned if a deposit was sent out to the vendor. CFO will be checking on this.

There was a discussion on a DJ vs. a Band and the fireworks. Mayor Hutnick commented we have to work on getting food vendors now and vendor booths.

Fish Stocking at Heaters Pond – Councilman Opilla commented what he mentioned last meeting was the base approach.

Weed Treatment at Heaters Pond – Councilman Opilla commented he is waiting for a call back on the weed treatment to see what his options are there. It looks like our goal is to do a fish stocking now hopefully within the next couple of weeks and the second one in the fall and to see what the budget will be for next year and following up with additional stock.

Vicky Schroder, 60 Center Street asked if the pond was being stocked in the fall will it be in the beginning of September and we can do fishing contest that morning [of Ogdensburg Day].

Councilman Opilla commented we can do it anyway whether it's stocked or not.

Mrs. Schroder asked if that is something we would want to do have a fishing contest in the morning of Ogdensburg Day.

There was a discussion on a fishing contest. The swim team usually runs the fishing contest.

Hydrant Flushing – Councilwoman Slater commented things are going well; they got a couple more done we are still 60 plus and there is maybe 99 all together; they should be done by August. They ran into a couple problems here and there, but no real complaints so far.

Seasonal Employee- Councilwoman Slater commented Joe started two weeks ago, doing great and having a good time, working hard he is doing well. We can take this off the agenda.

Employee Handbook- Councilwoman Slater explained now that our attorney is back from vacation [he can review the updates].

Mr. McBriar commented he did get some feedback from the CFO and some others so he is collating them and updating them and hopefully he will have an update by the next meeting and thank you for your patience.

Municipal Alliance Update – Councilwoman O'Dell commented we have a meeting coming up this Wednesday we are going to look into the verbiage if it is going to benefit us or not; so she doesn't know what to expect at this point.

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Mayor Hutnick asked if anyone is coming from the County. Councilwoman O'Dell commented she has only spoken to him, this is coming from Monica and she will be here.

Ogdensburg 5-K Run- Councilwoman O'Dell commented she will be speaking with Andy tomorrow; not really too much other then advertizing.

Mayor Hutnick commented thanks to Chief Gordon we were able to get signs from the County; those flashing signs about the race.

Pump House – Councilman Nardini commented he is putting together a timeline and spreadsheet with Rob on what we need to get done. We get bits and pieces every time he goes in there certain things are broken and things are in the works. Making sure we get two quotes on the major work that needs to be done, starting date and completion. We really should wait until the hydrant flushing is done. Councilman Nardini wants to get timelines on the work and get this done and who is doing what. He had somebody out looking at the roof we need to remove the rocks but we don't want to do anything until we know when they are coming to do the work.

Councilman Nasisi explained work that will be done on the pump house roof.

Councilman Nardini commented he is also coordinating work being done on the lifeguard swim shack and explained.

There was a discussion on repairs.

Heaters Pond Lifeguard and Swim Building – discussion above.

Swim dock – Councilman Nardini commented Chris did fix the dock to the point where the dock is going up and down and it settles on the pylons the right way and explained. Swim Docks can be removed also [from the agenda].

Garbage bid update – Mayor Hutnick commented we have already discussed this.

Dog Waste Stations – Councilwoman O'Dell commented she found a better deal than what she had last meeting and explained.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Hutnick asked if anyone had any new business before we start.

Councilman Nasisi commented he had something he wanted Robin to put in. Councilman Nasisi explained sometime things fall under buildings and grounds for certain areas one time then not another there is no uniformity. If the town owns the building it seems like it does and sometimes it doesn't he doesn't know what budget you are going to work off of for the DPW roof or we may have it in capital to work off that roof.

Councilwoman Slater asked this never came up under DPW.

Councilman Nasisi commented it is the salt shed roof, he doesn't know how bad it is; he can check with Chris. The quotes received previously were discussed.

Councilman Nasisi commented there are just some gray areas and he just wanted to get the Councils feel on if these buildings and maintenance of those building fall under building and grounds. All buildings it's a structure that the town owns.

There was a discussion on were in the budget repairs should go, water should stay under water, building and grounds is for Borough Hall, Historical building. There was a discussion on this being a gray area.

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Land Use Board Letter dated June 3, 2019 to Mayor and Council. – Mayor Hutnick read the letter from the Land Use Board regarding their concerns over the number of trucks and accidents on 517 and their concern for the residents and students safety.

Mayor Hutnick commented we have started this on our own with increased police patrols; the police have done an incredible job with slowing everybody down. They are pulling over a lot of the trucks coming through and things seem to have settled down from their point of view. We can't limit 517.

The Council discussion what they have done, everyone always blames the truck driver but it isn't always the truck drivers fault, the last accident the truck driver got hit.

Councilman Nasisi asked if we could designate a section in town as a safety corridor or something like that regardless of how is at fault but because of the cluster of accidents that has happened.

Councilman Nasisi asked Freeholder Fantasia if we could even just get the signs a safety corridor, Ogdensburg is already known for its police presence but a sign at the beginning of the town a Safety Corridor.

Sgt. Davis stepped forward and said they can also say fines double in this zone.

Freeholder Fantasia commented on the age of the guardrails; the County is aware of this so slowly but surely they will be updated. Not saying this would have prevented the accident that happened but hopefully new rails will help in the future. Ms. Fantasia commented she will bring that up at the next meeting on how to designate something.

Mayor Hutnick commented Engine Breaking signs will be posted soon. Police and residents are doing a good job.

Bond Ordinance/Plant Street – Mayor Hutnick commented on the grant received for Plant Street \$223,000; we have two year to use the grant and explained the engineering firm and DPW Supervisor is looking into the project. We are applying for additional grants.

Ms. Hough asked the Engineering firm is looking for guidance as to what applications the Council would like to apply for. Mayor Hutnick commented Gene was looking at Brooks Flat.

Councilwoman Slater commented there is also the mess at Predmore. Councilman Opilla commented there was also a mess by the bridge.

Ms. Hough asked what streets to apply grants for. Mayor Hutnick commented Passaic and Brooks Flat. They are two heavily traveled roads.

NJDOT Grant Applications – See above.

PUBLIC SESSION

Councilman Alvarez moved, Councilman Opilla seconded motion to open the public session of the meeting. All were in favor.

Dawn Fantasia, County Freeholder, commented she grew up in Ogdensburg. Ms. Fantasia commented we started something new this year; a Municipal Liaison pilot program. What that means is that each Freeholder is assigned to four or five towns in the County to go show our face make personal contact and to make a more personalized touch. We are all Freeholder at large but this is to make a better relationship between the County and the Towns. Ms. Fantasia comments her towns are Franklin, Ogdensburg, Hardyston, Hamburg and Vernon.

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Ms. Fantasia commented a few things we have on deck is to establish a County Ethics Board as you know if there are Ethics concerns in any kind of County Government it goes to the State and you can wait years to get any kind of resolution on it. We are trying to get a County Ethics Board so we can get an accelerated resolution to any issues that anyone might have and that is by partisan you just follow the State established guidelines. So, our Health Department if you saw in the paper the gentleman that passed away from powassan virus from ticks and explained a group she was working with called the tick squad based out of Vernon. They will come to the Mayor and Council meeting and/or the School and explained. Ms. Fantasia also explained a bill regarding education on tick. Ms. Fantasia commented on a question the County is trying to get on the ballot regarding immigration enforcement.

Vicki Schroder, 60 Center Street, commented on the garbage contract and asked if there could be additional bulk pick up days. There was a discussion on bulk pickup.

There being no further business from the public, Councilman Alvarez moved, Councilman Nasisi seconded motion to close the public session of the meeting. All were in favor.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

There was no executive session.
